Dear ICLAS Members and Friends,

With sadness, we share the news of the death on January 19th, 2018, of Dr. Jean Maisin, a past-president and governing board member of ICLAS.

Prof. Jean René Maisin was born May 25th, 1928. He very actively promoted quality in animal research and animal welfare at a national and international level. Prof. Maisin founded the Belgian Council for Laboratory Animal Science (BCLAS) in 1983. He served many years as Governing Board Member, Vice-President and President of ICLAS (1988-1995), and continued as an Honorary Member. After many years of Presidency with BCLAS, he remained active in his role as an Honorary Member. Prof. Maisin was also prominent in the Belgian National Deontological Committee on Animal Research for many years. He will be remembered with profound respect and gratitude.
